



Student survey on green mobility and travel

This online survey has been designed in the context of the **Sustainable Erasmus+ Travel (SET) project** funded under the Erasmus+ programme. The project aims to improve students' opportunities to engage in more environmentally sustainable habits during their mobility and change the narrative regarding the trip to the mobility destination as a transformative experience in itself. Coordinated by the European University Foundation (EUF), the project is implemented in close collaboration with three universities, Charles University, University of Porto and University of Zurich, the Erasmus Student Network (ESN), and with two associate partners, Erasmus by Train and Generation Climate Europe. The objective of this survey is to gain a better understanding of the latest patterns, priorities, challenges and suggestions from students on the link between Erasmus+ and sustainable travel. Even more so, we aim to analyse the implementation of different support measures from European universities, as well as uncover what is necessary to bridge the gap between environmental awareness and action.

The survey is targeting the student population that has either participated in an Erasmus+ mobility abroad, or is preparing for one in the near future. It invites students of different ages, nationalities, socioeconomic backgrounds, degrees of special needs, study levels, disciplines, and types of enrollment.

The survey consists of four sections: a) Identification, b) University/study data, c) Daily habits and civic engagement, d) Transport data, and e) Final. The language of the survey is English, therefore all answers should be provided in the same language only. It takes ca. 10-20 minutes to complete the survey.

The deadline to complete the survey is Friday, 13 December 2024 at midnight.
